Dear Prime Minister:

On balance I thought there were quite few admirable aspects to your first budget.

There was one point, however, that distressed me greatly. You plan to borrow the shortfall, and increase our federal debt by about \$100 billion during your four year mandate. You don't need to borrow that money when the federal parliament has 100 % power over money and banking in Canada. You can get all the money you need through the Bank of Canada as we did from 1939 to 1974 with such great success.

You are probably aware of the plan entitled "A New Social Contract Between the Government and People of Canada." I urge you to adopt that plan, and now, so that we will have the benefit from the rapid growth that will result. I also urge you not to ratify the CETA agreement you signed on Oct 30th.

Please don't disappoint us.

Dear Minister:

Your first budget was probably as good as you could get within the accepted rules. But there is still much more to do, and the rules can be changed at any time because the parliament of Canada has 100% control over these matters.

You could more than double the positive impact by adopting the plan known as “A New Social Contract Between the Government and People of Canada” that was written by 40 very concerned Canadians. It involves the active assistance of the Bank of Canada similar to the system we had in effect from 1939 to 1974, that proved to be so successful.

And when you reply, don't tell me that to adopt this plan would be inflationary. It isn't so, and certainly isn't necessary! I understand that during our Golden years Canada's inflation rate was comparable to the average for 15 OECD countries. And we can do better now when we know that much of the inflation we had was cost push, and had nothing to do with the use of government created money.

So please don't let us down.
